## Painting 1 Class Supplies <br> Art supplies can be found at Jackson Wal-Mart, Staples, or Hobby Lobby.

Here are the supplies that you must have for the Painting I class:
1 Pocket folder for notes and handouts, Pencils and erasers.
Watercolor paint set-- Prang (if you want a CLEAN set of your own). Can be Pan Paints or tube paints-your preference. This will be supplied by school but you may not want to use the often us paint pans.
1 white Poster board- 1 full piece or ${ }^{1 / 2}$ piece if you want to share with a friend.
*Ziploc storage bags-1 gallon size, 5-but you can also bring a box. This is to seal you palette. Brushes--- will be supplied by the school, but you may want to get a few of your own. Or you can get some fairly good brushes at Wal-Mart, back in the Arts and Crafts section. You won't need expensive brushes.
Paints--- will be supplied by the school. Some extra acrylic colors, you may want to purchase at Hobby Lobby.
*1 Roll of masking tape
Colored Pencils---1 box. You may use the pencils that I have here at school, but you may want to have some of your own.
*Palettes-to mix paints and keep from drying out/ready for the next day of painting.
*Containers---To store your supplies in (shoe boxes, plastic storage boxes, etc.)
*Air-tight Containers-to save your paints in so that they will not dry out (Plastic containers with lids work great. Also try yogurt or sour cream, etc. containers with lids.)
Papers---Watercolor, Specialty Papers (wait until I show examples). The school supplies 1 variety of watercolor paper (cold press) but you may want a different surface/ kind. For instance, hot press (very smooth surface).
5 Canvas-16" x 20" or larger. Stretched Canvas or Canvas Panel. If you like a smoother painting surface, use the Watercolor Canvas.) Or you can work on illustration board.

1-Watercolor Paper Pad (Wait until Hobby Lobby Has a sale on sketchbooks and paper pads.)

Primers---White House paint or Gesso. You only need gesso if you decide to do your paintings on the Masonite. Panels and canvas are already pre-primed when purchased.

Photos, sketches, magazine or calendar photos, etc.--that you have saved for art assignments. When you have an "idea" due to begin a project, you will be required to bring in your resource photos. This is a part of every assignment---something that you will have to prepare for.
Photos taken with your own phone or camera. You may take some on your own or bring some photos that you have taken yourself. This will allow you to create Original art works. But for the practice and learning the techniques - magazine photos are fine. Will also work from observation.

Optional items: Modeling Paste -in acrylic medium section at Hobby Lobby (small jar or squeeze tube), Calligraphy markers, Watercolor Markers or Alcohol Markers, Metallic Watercolors, Masking fluid (for use with watercolors), Oil Pastels.These are not required and I will explain these during the semester. Some students choose to get these to work with in their paintings. Some plan to go further in their art classes and college, so they choose to invest in the additional supplies for their own use.
