Watercolor Supply List

Note: Since you have already completed Painting 1 and 2, you will already have most of the supplies except the watercolor Paper Pad. Check the list and you can pick up what you don't have.

Art supplies can be found at Jackson Wal-Mart, Staples, or Hobby Lobby.

1 Pocket folder for notes and handouts, Pencils and erasers.

Watercolor paint set-- Prang (if you want a CLEAN set of your own). These can be pan paints or tube paints—your preference. Or art dept. has the pans but they have all been used by others. If you do not like to use used watercolors you may bring your own set. 1-Watercolor Paper Pad (Wait until Hobby Lobby has a sale on sketchbooks and paper pads.)

Brushes— will be supplied by the school, but you may want to get a few of your own. Or you can get some fairly good brushes at Wal-Mart, back in the Arts and Crafts section. You won't need expensive brushes.

- *1 Roll of masking tape (at least 1 roll –many use 2 to tape down your watercolor paper). Watercolor Colored Pencils---1 box. You may use the pencils that I have here at school, but you may want to have some of your own.
- *Palettes—to mix paints and keep from drying out/ready for the next day of painting.
- *Containers---To store your supplies in (shoe boxes, plastic storage boxes, etc.)
- **Papers** (**individual sheets**)--Watercolor, Specialty Papers (*You can wait until I show examples*). The school supplies 1 variety of watercolor paper ('cold press') but you may want a different surface/ kind. For instance, 'hot press' (very smooth surface). Just wait until we talk about papers for you to decide if you want the large sheets of a different kind.
- *Scrap---"Scrap" are pictures, photos, sketches, magazine or calendar photos, etc.--that you have saved for art assignments. When you have an "idea" due to begin a project, you will be required to bring in your "scrap". There is no possible way that I can supply "scrap" or visual resource materials--- for every student that I have in class. This is a part of every assignment---something that you will have to prepare for.

Photos taken with your own phone or camera. You may take some on your own or bring some photos that you have taken yourself. This will allow you to create *Original* art works. But for the *practicing* that we do, and learning the techniques—magazine photos are fine.

Optional items: Colored Pencil set, Calligraphy markers, Alcohol Inks, Watercolor Markers or Alcohol Markers, Metallic Watercolor set, masking fluid (for use with watercolors). These are not required and I will explain these during the semester. Some students choose to get these to work with in their paintings. Some plan to go further in their art classes and college, so they choose to invest in the additional supplies for their own future use.

Note: In case we ever must be out of school or doing 'virtual' learning, please be prepared with items left at home to be able to continue the assignments
